

Students will grasp how individuals actively construct and maintain social order through their everyday interactions in Garfinkel's theory.

Students develop a comprehensive understanding of the complex dynamics of social systems and institutions by studying Alexander's Neofunctionalism

Students will gain an insight of Gramsci's concept of Hegemony and Power

Paper-2 Techniques of Social Research

Course Outcomes
