## Phase-VI, Programme-01 One Day Online Workshop on

## **Writing of Instructional Objectives**

## **Brief Report**

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University (Central University), New Delhi established under the scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India organized One Day Online Workshop on Writing of Instructional Objectives for Students & Research Scholars of all disciplines of our university dated 29th April, 2022 which is the 01st programme of Phase-VI. The objectives of this workshop were to familiarize with the basic elements and concepts of instructional objectives, classification of objectives according to Blooms Taxonomy & level-wise writing of instructional objectives. This workshop was conducted online through Google Meet platform. The inaugural session commenced with the welcome speech and backdrop note by the Director of the Centre Prof. Amita Pandey Bhardwaj and ended with vote of thanks. In addition to inaugural & valedictory the workshop was transacted with demonstration 02 technical sessions Question & Answer and 01 each self-practice, online assessment and feedback sessions. The registrations received till last date were 130 and the same continued the programme successfully. The participants were from 08 Departments of SLBSNS University, New Delhi, which were - Education (114), Jain Darshan (01), Jyotish (01), Dharamshastra (01), Vastushastra (04), Vyakarana (01), Vishishtadvaita (01) and Sahitya (07). All the technical sessions were conducted under the able guidance of **01 Resource Person (Table-I)** having expertise in this area. The main themes covered in the workshop were-Instructional Objectives and Bloom's Taxonomy (Exercises) and Writing of Instructional Objectives (components, level-wise action verbs & Writing of Objectives with Exercises). An online test was administered where 62% of the participants scored above 60%. In order to ensure the quality of the lectures delivered from the participants' point of view an online feedback about the lectures was taken in 04 categories viz. Outstanding, Very good, Good & Satisfactory and the average found was 73%, 22%, 02% & 03% in the respective categories. In addition to this, online feedback about the workshop was also taken on 10 points in five categories and the average percentage was found to be 66% Excellent, 25% Very good, 08% Good, 01% Satisfactory and **00% Unsatisfactory**. In the valedictory session, the Director of the Centre welcomed and presented the workshop outcomes followed by Presidential address of **Prof. Ramesh Prasad Pathak** (Ex-Head & Dean, School of Education, SLBSNSU, N. Delhi). The workshop ended with vote of thanks and Shanti Path. After the completion of the workshop, the e-Certificate were mailed to the successful participants.
