#### 16. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The University has implemented NEP 2020 from the academic session 2021-22 and accordingly four year Bachelor's Degree programmes with multiple entry and exit system (MEES) has been introduced. The curriculum for all the UG programmes has been designed and implemented as per the UGC-CCFUP guidelines. Designed curriculum framework has the features of multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary Major and Minor Courses. 21 multidisciplinary courses are offered by the University at UG level Curriculum frameworks providing flexibility for learners to move from one discipline to another through major and minor streams. It provides opportunity for choosing courses of their interest in various disciplines like Computer Applications, Political Science, Sociology, Environmental Science etc. The University is also planning to open new schools and new departments of both traditional and modern streams of Knowledge.

#### 17. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Our university very successfully introduced the Academic Bank of Credit system under the National Education Policy 2020, thus offering more flexibility and mobility to students across institutions. It introduced a dedicated task force for integrating the ABC in the overall academic structure, which assists credit accrual and transfer between different programs and universities. The university modernized its digital infrastructure to back the ABC platform and enable seamless registration and credit management for all students. Faculty and administrative staff are trained to better assist students in navigating the ABC system, empowering students to design personal academic paths that better fit their learning needs and encourage a more flexible, learner-centered education experience. In general, the ABC system has enhanced academic flexibility, especially in interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary learning.

#### 18. Skill development:

University believes that Skill Development is crucial for the students to enhance their creativity, empolyability and overall personality development. The University has made significant efforts for skill development by integrating Shastric knowledge with modern competencies. The University has added 22 skill enhancement, 16 ability enhancement and 22 value added courses that include soft skills, cognitive skills, digital skills, social skills etc. Integrated skill development courses have been introduced in all the programmes in accordance to NEP-2020. Along with courses like Computer Programming, Effective Communation, Environmental Conservation etc, the university also promotes skills like spoken sanskrit, indian language courses, puran pravachan, jyotish, vastu, paurohitya etc. The University also encourages experiential learning through internship, field work, projects, classroom assignments etc. A wide range of certificate and diploma courses prepare students for immediate employment by equipping them with practical skills which facilitate a smooth transition into their chosen profession.

### 19. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The university embeds Indian Knowledge System (IKS) through its core structure and curriculum. The university through various departments like Veda, Puarohitya, Vyakaran, Dharmshastra, Jyotish, Vastushastra, Nyaya, Sankhyayoga, Jain-Darshan, Sarva-Darshan, Mimansa, Vishishtadvait-vedant, Advait-vedant, Sahitya, Puranetihas, Prakrit, Hindu Studies, Yoga highlights and promotes IKS through its vision and mission. IKS has also been incorporated into Professional courses like B.Ed, M.Ed and various certificate/diploma courses. All the courses are designed to integrate Indian Knowledge System and Traditional arts with modern education. The curriculum for these courses are designed in accordance to CCFUP guidelines (NEP-2020). The university encourages the use of indigenous research methodologies that respect and incorporate traditional knowledge systems in scholarly work. Students are taught that by weaving IKS into the fabric of academic studies, programs can foster a richer understanding of both traditional and contemporary knowledge, promoting respect for diverse worldviews and practices.

#### 20. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Our university adopted Outcome-Based Learning (OBL) to focus on specific, measurable learning outcomes for all academic programs. This adjustment posed more emphasis on declarative learning outcomes at the program, course, and module levels and directed the learner to attain practical, industry-related competencies. Competency profiles are adopted at every level of study. With such a structure, programs are re-engineered so that students could gain core competencies and knowledge packages ensuring them better preparedness for the world outside. Continuous assessments come in the form of project work, presentations, case studies, among others, applied to mark the realization of these results. More specifically, faculty received professional development on developing curriculum maps and rubrics in relation to learning outcomes; all activities are aligned with the intended learning results. Graduate attributes like problem-solving, critical thinking, and ethical decision-making are also noted as essential elements for all programs across the university. Capstone projects, internships, and industry collaborations are also considered to transfer the learning in real settings to recondition the student's skills. Regular feedback mechanisms for monitoring students and modifying the teaching strategies based on evidence ensure improvement in performance, employability, and satisfaction among the students. The university focused on what students are expected to achieve by the end of each course and program so that

graduates are not just academically sound but also capable of contributions to their field.

#### 21. Distance education/online education:

The university embraced digital transformation through conducting online lectures, workshops, remedial classes, and tutorial classes to enhance learning and flexibility of the students. It smoothed out activities to enable easy access to quality education anywhere. We held workshops on emerging topics and skill development, remedial classes, and extra classes, in case some needed support. Some teachers even use google classroom as learning management system to benift the students. The university is also planning to make the usage of LMS compulsory and launching this in phases. The university is planning to launch online courses in the future. This will help students from across the globe to virtually connect and study from the University.

1.1 - Curriculum Design and Development	

1.1.1 - Curricula developed and implemented have relevance to the local, national, regional and global developmental needs which is reflected in Programme outcomes (POs), Programme Specific Outcomes(PSOs) and Course Outcomes(COs) of the Programmes offered by the University

All the programs of the University are conducted according to the academic calendar following the guidelines of the University Grants Commission (UGC) and NCTE. All the course was conducted by the university under CCFUP as per the directives of the University Grants Commission under the selection-option based credit system.

Students are admitted to courses like Shastri, BA Yoga, Acharya, MA, Shikshashatri, Shikshacharya, Vidyavaridhi, six-month certificate programmes, one-year PG Diploma and two-year PG Diploma through national level entrance examinations. POs, PSOs, COs and LOs for all these courses are available on the college website. Students are offered courses on Multidisciplinary, Skill bases, ability based, value added baskets along with the major and the minor mainstream courses. The university's diverse academic offerings reflect local, national, and global developmental goals, ensuring students acquire relevant skills. A collaborative curriculum design process involves both internal faculty and external experts, allowing for dynamic and contextually relevant programs. The curriculum includes subjects like Introduction to the Indian Philosophyand modern disciplines like Sociology, Computer Applications, Enviromental Scienceand Political Science, fostering critical skills and enhancing employability. Community engagement initiatives, especially the Purohit program, emphasize social responsibility and practical skills.

#### 1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

### 1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability into the Curriculum

Professional Ethics: The concept of professional ethics is often approached from traditional philosophical frameworks rooted in ancient Indian thought. A key principle that serves as the ethical foundation in many of these teachings is "Vasudhaiva Kutumbakam" (वस्थेव कुट्मवर्म्), which means "the world is one family." The courses on Ved, Puran, Sahitya, Darshan, Nyaya etcteachstudents to understand the core fundamental principles of Indian Knowledge System and to look beyond personal gain and focus on the larger well-being of society, aligning with the ethical responsibilities professionals have toward society.

Gender Studies: There are dedicated papers on Gender Studies on Shastri and B.Ed courses and various papers in Acharya, MA, M.Ed have dedictated units on Gender equality and sensitization. The university has a dedicated Centre for Women studies that play a pivotal role in organizing various awareness programmes and workshops related to gender equality.

Human Values: Human Values are taught in all shastri and B.Ed courses. Also key texts like "Uttararamacharita" explore the value of good qualities, while "Yajnavalkya Smriti" emphasizes ethical conduct, "Sundarakanda" highlights charity and responsibilities, and the "Shukla Yajurveda" promotes non-stealing and animal protection.

Environment & Sustainability: There is a compulsory curriculum that motivates environmental education, emphasizing nature, water, and land conservation for Shastri and B.Ed students. Post gradutaion programme in Environmental Science is also proposed by the university.

The university has several strategies of improvement for slow learners likeremedial classes. The university hosts a remedial Sanskrit Camp for slow learners, focusing on basic vyakaran and conversational skills. Short-term courses offered include Spoken English, Sanskrit Sambhashan, Computer Literacy etc which dovetail with different needs of the students. Faculty members are always available to cater to the needs of these students and provide doubt solving/ revision of topics etc.

The University encourages discovery of special talents and skills in students. Educational tours, participation invarious competitions is encouranged and the faculty members escord the students to attend/participate in the same. Workshops and seminars are organized forthestudents to gain special knowledge over and above the curriculum.

Students from deprived backgrounds are counselled emotionally and professionally to ensure that they satisfactorily complete their courses on time. This enhances other skills toward employability.

### 2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problemsolving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The University follows the student-centered approaches to resolve the students proplems. Itencourages the environment of exploration and critical thinking and active involvement. Experimental learning is implemented through hands-on activities, such as laboratory experiments and fieldwork. Projects and assignements are created based on real-world problems, fostering critical thinking. Internships and practical training help bridging theory and practice. Simulations and role-playing exercises create immersive scenarios for deeper understanding of complex topics.

Participative learning is encouraged though group discussions, group assignments, team activities and collaborative learning. University

2.6.2 - Attainment of Programme outcomes, Programme specific outcomes and course outcomes are evaluated by the institution during the year

The process of evaluation and assessment is in constant light with the faculty members at SLBSNSU through a variety of methods such as assignments, surprise tests, viva voce, open book tests, quizzes, projects, internships, and so forth. Such evaluation techniques are implemented according to the POs and PSOs achieved by each student. The evaluation methodology involved both direct and indirect methods. Direct methodology involves examination and observations for assessing the knowledge and expertise of the students according to specific measurable outcomes specified in the courses.

- Internal Assessment: Assignments and presentations and class tests are usually used for continuous evaluation. Each paper consists of atleast 20% weightage for internal assessment.

### 3.1.1 - The institution Research facilities are frequently updated and there is well defined policy for promotion of research which is uploaded on the institutional website and implemented

At the university there is a dedicated Research department whichtakes care of the reseach related policies and manages the course work to be done by the students. Each department has a Departmental Research Committee that oversees department and subject specific research, ensuring compliance with UGC Regulations. The DRC comprises the Head of the Department (Chairman), Dean of the Faculty, Senior Most Professor, and Supervisor. Additionally, a Research Board, led by the Vice-Chancellor, is responsible for finalizing Ph.D. student registrations. Its composition includes all Deans, a Senior Most Professor (nominated by the VC), a member of the Academic Council (also nominated),

three external academic experts, the HoD (Research), and the Controller of Examination, with the Registrar serving as Secretary. After completing the course work, students must submit a soft copy of their research synopsis and present a pre-submission seminar to facilitate discussion and feedback. The research thesis is also submitted electronically for uploading on INFLIBNET. The viva-voce is conducted by the examination section with the external examiner, supervisor, HoD, Dean, and Ph.D. students present, allowing participation from other faculty and research students as well.

University is equipped with three modern AC labs featuring internet access, interactive boards, LCD TVs, multimedia projectors, and various educational software to enhance student learning and prepare them for future challenges. Additionally, smart classrooms equipped with ICT tools have been established for research scholars and students.

The university has a Learning Management System (LMS) for managing and sharing audio, video and text based e-content pertaining to the prescribed syllabiof various offered programmes. In addition to this, the university also encouragesfaculty members to offer online courses via platforms like MOOCS.

The University has a Manuscript Conservation Center with 1697 manuscripts related to various scripture. These Pandu-lipis are related to various branches of Sanskrit literature. Significant efforts have been made to digitize these texts, with 1,000 manuscripts, 200 books, and 125 issues of the

Shodhprabha quarterly research magazine converted into e-texts, while the remaining texts are in the process of being digitized.

Varahamihira Observatory, Smarta KarmkandaPrayogshala, Shraut Yajnashala, Psychology Laboratory etc provide studens with oppurtunities to apply their theoratical knowledge and get hands on experience.

#### 4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

The University Library has implemented an integrated library management system, namely, Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), for the holistic management of the library. LIBSYS 10 (Web Centric) is being utilized in the existing set-up; it was upgraded from the LIBSYS version-7 in February 2022. The automation work of the library had been commenced in the year 2011 with the acquisition and installation of LIBSYS version-7. This ILMS has integrated all modules fully functional such as Acquisition, Cataloguing, Circulation, Serials Control, and Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC). The system worked in serverclient mode whereby the central server housed in the University's Computer Centre housed the data centralized at that location. Five terminals/machines located on the server were positioned in the library so as to ensure seamless automation activities. SLBSNSU has revolutionized the automation process further by introducing the Radio Frequency Identification Device (RFID) technology in the year 2021. The said technology involves tagging almost all books with radio frequency devices hence streamlining the overall processes of the library. This fully automated library system, running on LIBSYS 10 (Web Centric), demonstrates SLBSNSU's commitment to using technology effectively for efficient library management. The injection of ILMS and RFID technology into the system adds more touches of a modern and digitized library environment, promoting high accessibility and user friendliness for the academic community.

A notable accomplishment is the introduction of a four-year undergraduate program with multiple entry and exit options, reflecting the university's commitment to modernization. In accordance with UGC guidelines (CCFUP), the curriculum has been updated with new subjects under categories such as Multidisciplinary (MD), Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), Value Added Courses (VAC), and internship opportunities. These additions give students more flexibility in choosing courses that align with NEP criteria.

#### 6.4.4 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

The university maintains a dual system of financial audits, conducting both internal and external reviews regularly. The Accounts Department, under the supervision of the Finance Officer, plays a crucial role in the daily financial operations of the institution. It ensures the accurate maintenance of annual accounts and oversees audits. All bills are carefully examined to ensure compliance with government regulations. The inclusion of a GST number on financial bills is mandatory when applicable, and payments are only processed for bills that meet these criteria.

The Accounts Department processes all university bills in accordance with government financial guidelines. External audits are conducted by the Comptroller and Auditor General (C&AG), who performs a yearly certification audit and periodic transaction audits based on a risk assessment schedule. The results of these audits are presented to the university's statutory bodies and subsequently submitted to the Ministry of Education for presentation to both houses of Parliament. For internal audits, the university has engaged an Internal Audit Officer on a contractual basis, ensuring ongoing financial oversight and accountability.

- Building new hostels: University's goal is to build a girls' hostel with at least 200 rooms and a separate boys' hostel which will have an accommodation capacity of 200 rooms for the students.
- Development of new Schools and Departments: Introduce new departments and courses, blending modern with a touch of traditional education to give added value to the academic offerings.
- Integrated Teacher Education Program: Initiate an ITEPprogram under the Schoolof Education that will effectively train future teachers.
