Maintenance of Campus Infrastructure

4.4.2

Established systems and procedures for maintaining and utilizing physical, academic and support facilities - laboratory, library, sports complex, computers, classrooms etc., exists.

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Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University has a structured system for maintaining facilities like laboratories, libraries, sports grounds, and reading rooms, managed by committees including subject experts and student representatives. The Library Advisory and Book Purchase Committees oversee book acquisitions and preservation of ancient texts. The library offers books and audio-visual materials, with regular pest control for preservation.

The Sports Committee organizes activities and trains students for internal and state competitions, ensuring they can compete with students from other universities. Major maintenance of sports grounds is overseen by the University Works Department.

The Procurement Committee recommends purchases of materials like writing supplies and equipment, while the Maintenance Committee oversees repairs of worn-out items. The University Works Department handles major maintenance, addressing water leaks and ensuring cleanliness. Efficient waste disposal and upkeep of gardens and walkways contribute to a clean, vehicle-free environment.

Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University maintains a Computer Lab for student applications and practical classes, alongside a Language Lab to enhance spoken skills in Sanskrit and English. The Education Department features three labs: Psychology, Educational Technology, and Language Lab, with a departmental library. Established in March 2007, the Psychology Lab seats 30 with arrangements of students and accommodates 15 for experiments, housing 169 experiments and 25 devices to support Ph.D. research requirements.

The Educational Technology Lab at Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University accommodates 44 students for practical work in educational technology. The Language Lab, established in 2013, seats having seating arrangements of 57 students. The Department's library, founded in 2015, supports academic and research activities with a diverse collection, including

traditional educational books and modern resources. It is accessible to other university students with proper permission. The library's acquisition committee recommends new purchases as needed. The Department features 11 classrooms: six for 60 students, three for 30, and two smaller ones for 10, plus two large classrooms with stages and PTZ camera facilities.

The Psychology Lab conducts psychological experiments as part of the curriculum, and computer experts are designated to manage these labs. A hostel is available for male students, equipped with essential amenities like electric lights, fans, beds, and desks. A hostel warden is appointed to oversee hostel management. Special facilities are provided for differently-abled students, including accessible pathways. CCTV cameras have been installed for security. Several committees also provide indirect support for the utilization of educational and support facilities. These include the Central Research Committee, Anti-Ragging Cell, Healthy Communication Committee, Student Welfare Committee, Discipline Committee, Publication Committee, Human Rights Committee, Anti-Harassment Committee, and the Student Counselling and Placement Committee etc....
